Then and only then **Write legibly**. Pace yourself, each question should be allotted about eight (8) minutes to answer. This is an open book and open note test. That means you may use your Bible and your own notes (but not the notes and Bibles of others). Each question requires at least five (5) separate Bible passages (for example, Gen 1:1-2; Matt 1:1; Acts 2:1-3; Rom 12:1-2; Rev 1:4; NOT John 1:1-5). There are 100 points possible for this exam. Each question is worth 20 points. 1. What are three background rules for rightly dividing? Use at least five (5) separate Bible passages in your answer.
2. What are the five questions for rightly dividing? Use at least five (5) separate Bible passages in your answer.
3. Using the rules of rightly dividing, explain if the word “us” is appropriate in Genesis 1:26. Use at least five (5) separate Bible passages in your answer.
4. Using the rules of rightly dividing, prove what the rock” is in Matthew 16:18. Use at least five (5) separate Bible passages in your answer.
5. Using the rules of rightly dividing, what does the word “word” mean in John 1:1? Use at least five (5) separate Bible passages in your answer.
