# BAPTISTICHURCHAUTHORITY

It may seem strange to some to ask the question about such a commonly used expression, but really! Have you ever wondered just what is "Church Authority", in Baptist polity today?

I heard one pastor tell another pastor one time, while discussing "Church Authority", "Your liberty ends where my nose begins." Another has said, "The church doesn't have a mind, the pastor is the mind of the church." Still another has said, "Baptists don't need the Bible, it's the will of the majority expressed in a vote at any given meeting." Such whimsical notions remind one of a bouncing ball. It depends on what court the ball falls, as to who has "Church Authority" in the conclave of some today. For example: If it's right for an ambitious man in a given state to start a Bible school, own a monthly paper, set up a library, employ and dismiss faculty members, grant awards and grant degrees, etc. Of course, all this is done by "Church Authority"?-?-? Why is it wrong for another sister church and pastor, in the same state, equal in authority to do essentially the same thing?-? Could it be, that a position of a super power is being sought, instead of being satisfied with the Lord's autonomous body at home? Is it possible in our day, for -New Testament churches, in any given state to meet as equals in associated work, without someone trying to usurp their own authority by importing muscle power from without to aid their own ego?

Yes verily: True Baptist churches and pastors have always, since the days of Christ and His apostles, found their own Christ centered level of fellowship and associated work and let the rest go by the way of the wind. History is replete with our Baptist forefathers who knew how to burn but never to turn from the "Authority" that Jesus lodged within His churches and is there resident. The "Authority" of our Lord's churches has been abused, excused, and refused by the machinery of men as is evident in some Baptist circles today. But the "Authority" to teach, preach, baptize and send forth missionaries and to do all things commanded of our blessed Lord is still the business of our Lord's autonomous bodies. There are many today who will never seek immunity from this law by being crystallized in a council, association, or conventionism. They know this patent truth is to be sacred and not to be relinquished. There seems to be three main branches of government, or

polity, that stands out in religious circles today: Congregational, Presbyteries and Episcopal. Congregational means with all the members of a congregation exercising their equal rights by voting. Presbyteries is a government by presbyters or elders. Episcopal is to be ruled by the bishops. True Baptists are congregational which the Bible

Though the Bible is still the best seller among books, even God's people have varied opinions as to how we have received the Scriptures.

If there are words in the Bible which are there by man's authority we can put no confidence in them, neither can we distinguish between God's words and man's, except they be specified by the writer, as in I Corinthians 7:6. God gave Paul permission to write those exact words, giving them equal authority with the rest of the Bible because they weren't in the Old Testament.

There are basically four theories as to how we received God's Word:

### 1. THE IDEATION THEORY

God gave to men the idea and left them to write as best they could. (Naturally, they would make some mistakes).

# 2. THE ASPIRATION THEORY

It teaches that God inspired the writers in the same manner in which Poe, Longfellow, Shakespeare, and others were inspired. They saw things in their daily activities that caused them to concentrate, speculate, and aspire to write of high morals and truth.

# 3. THE SUPERINTENDENCE THEORY

Some theologians teach this as the Scriptural position, but the Scripture proofs fall under the heading of the Dictation Theory, in that the Superintendence Theory is referred to as Verbal Inspiration.

### 4. THE DICTATION THEORY

The Scriptural position, holding that God revealed by the Holy Spirit the exact words the writers were to write. This is Verbal Inspiration.

## I. WHAT THE BIBLE IS.

A. It is a Divine library of 66 books, divided into Old and New Testaments, 27 books in the New and 39 in the Old.

- B. It was written by about 40 different writers on three continents, in three languages over a period of about 1400 years with an interval of about 400 years between the last of the Old Testament books and the coming of John the Baptist. The first five books were written about 1300 B.C. Revelation was written about 96 A.D.
- C. Languages: Ancient Hebrew, Syriac-Chaldee (Aramic in minor portions), and

Koine Greek. (language of the common people)

# ERFEITERS & COUNTERFE

This is an article that was written by L.H. Boswell in 1948 while he was pastoring the Bend MBC in Bend, OR. This writing is just as true today as it was in 1948. It is sound Bible truth whether you are in Oregon, Washington, California or anywhere else. It has been stated, printed and promoted in the name of Missionary Baptist Church fellowship that God will overlook His precepts and doctrines if the pressure in a particular "locale" becomes too strong to stand against. To say, like some writers do, that just because you are in a different location it's alright to accept unscriptural baptism is absurd. If baptism is unscriptural in the west it is the same in the south. If accepting unscriptural baptism makes a church unscriptural in the west the same applies in the south. The greatest weakness among our churches today is rationalization of some of the identifying doctrines that have kept Baptist distinctive and given us hope there is a true church today. It seems that some today want to say that a church can practice anything she pleases and still belong to the Lord. They need to examine what the Lord said to the seven churches of Asia closely and find out they are wrong. Revelation Chapters 1-3 Introduction:

The devil is a usurper! In the beginning he aspired to dethrone God and take his



place. Failing in this, he evidently decided to rob God of all the glory he possibly could. Hence, he began on the human race by tempting Eve to doubt God's Word and accept his instead. When he fails to completely set aside that which is TRUE, he does the next best thing (for himself). He sets up something like the truth, yet which is, indeed, erroneous. In other words, when he can't get men to DENY the Truth, he gets them, if he can, to admit heretical doctrine to be EQUAL to Truth. Counterfeit churches and alien (counterfeit) baptism are good examples of what I've been saying. Webster defines the word counterfeit: "To make fraudulently or unlawfully, with intent to deceive. Something made fraudulently to resemble the genuine; an imita-

# I. COUNTERFEITERS AND COUNTER-

A. The devil found that he could not destroy the Church which Jesus set up and commissioned to make disciples by preaching the gospel (Romans 1:16), baptize them (the disciples), and teach the "made" "baptized" disciples ALL things He (Jesus) taught them. (Matthew 28:19-20) So, he did the next best thing. He made a counterfeit church! But he was too smart to set up a church with no connection at all with the True church. What did he do? He craftily entered one of the true churches, the one at Rome, and introduced doctrines of his own, which were contrary to truth, but carefully veneered with enough of Truth to beguile the innocent. He taught the Rome church that, in case of necessity it would meet God's approval to sprinkle (especially a sick man who was about to die) instead of baptize. He carefully, cautiously led that church step by step into heresy so deeply

that she could NOT extricate herself. Today, it is the Roman Catholic Church. You see plainly that he counterfeited the church by adulterating her doctrines.

B. A concrete example of this principle may be seen in money counterfeiting. A crook may take genuine coins and melt them down and adulterate them with inexpensive metals, re-cast them, and pass them, for a time, and to some people, for genuine coins. That's what the devil did to the church at Rome. Or, again, a crook may take metal that hasn't been used in coins and make it into coins with the exact metal proportions of genuine coins, seeing they have the right metal content. They lack the authority of government. If the government were to recognize as genuine all coins, regardless of who coined them so long as they contained the right metal, and all currency, it would be "out of business" in less time than it takes to tell it. Why? Because the economical stability of the government is based upon its ability to redeem at face value all its incoming currency and coins.

## II. BAPTISM AND THE CHURCH

A. Since a True church must be composed of scripturally baptized disciples (Acts 2:41), and since nothing but a True church can scripturally baptize (Matthew 28:19-20), the two are united in such a way that neither can exist long without the other. This is a self evident fact, and admitted by all True Baptists in all ages.

B. A church that recognizes alien (manmade) baptisms loses her identity. A church is a church, not by the name she wears, but by the lineage and doctrines she maintains. If a bank recognizes counterfeit money as equal with the genuine, she forfeits her charter and is soon bankrupt. What good money it has is still good, but the bank as

an institution is disfranchised. Why? Because she raises the value of counterfeit money to the level with the genuine; or putting it the other way, it lowers the value at least in its estimation, of the genuine down to the level of counterfeit. Thus, losing her authority to issue currency and operate as a bank. If that bank should issue currency under that condition, it would be counterfeiting money! That, likewise, is true of the church that recognizes manmade baptism; it loses its authority to baptize and that which she does administer for baptism is alien, counterfeit, unscriptural, and

should NOT receive it!

### III. BAPTISM AND THE SCRIPTURES

A. Baptism is a picture of the death. burial, and resurrection of Christ. (Romans 6:3-11) The death, burial, and resurrection of Christ is the Gospel. (I Corinthians 15:1-4) Hence, baptism is a picture of the Gos-

B. Galatians 1:6-9 pronounces a CURSE upon any who would pervert the Gospel. (preach another gospel) Thus, if a church recognizes as genuine an organization which perverts the gospel by teaching

that one's salvation depends upon his works of righteousness (even baptism), it becomes partaker with that organization of its evil. (II John 10:11) The same penalty is applied, without a church so doing, they are ACCURSED! They have no authority as a church and consequently can't administer Scriptural baptism.





TEXT: II Corinthians 5:10, Romans 14:10.12

The Bible declares that everyone must meet Christ in judgment. (Philippians 2:10-11) It speaks of at least three future judgments. THE SAVED will be judged at the Judgment Seat of Christ in Heaven, during the Great Tribulation period. THE NATIONS will be judged at the end of the Tribulation period when Christ comes with His saints to set up His earthly reign. THE UNSAVED will be judged at the end of the thousand year reign of Christ.

The Bible states that the Father hath committed all judgment unto the Son. Through His incarnation, Jesus earned the right to judge man, by conquering death, hell and the grave. In His humanity, He experienced every temptation and pain that man will ever experience. Therefore, man cannot excuse himself because of his human weakness because His Judge, "was in all points tempted like as we are, yet without sin," (Hebrew 4:15) The purpose of this judgment is to see what the believer has really accomplished after he was saved. Judged according to motive, quality, ability, opportunity and influence. (I Corinthians 3:13-17)

# TO THE MOTIVE OF HIS WORK.

Work not motivated by divine love is of no value whatsoever. (I Corinthians 13:1-3) Paul says that regardless of how gifted one may be, or how much he may sacrifice, his service is useless without divine love.

One may attend all worship services, study the Bible, pray, give and use his talent. The greatest sin that God's children commit is neglecting opportunities. The Bible says, "Therefore to him that knoweth to do good, and doeth it not, to him it is a sin." (James 4:17)

# (II) ONE WILL BE JUDGED ACCORDING TO THE QUALITY OF HIS WORK.

We live in a day when quantity is stressed at the expense of quality. Quantity is of no value whatsoever, if quality is ignored. One's work must be done according to the rules of the Bible. The Bible states that no man is crowned unless he strives lawfully. (II Timothy 2:15)

# (III) ONE WILL BE JUDGED ACCORD-ING TO HIS ABILITY.

Jesus knows what each one is capable of doing if he would surrender his life. He will judge him accordingly: as Jesus gave of the talents illustrating one's ability. (Matthew 25:14-30)

(IV) ONE WILL BE JUDGED ACCORD-ING AS TO HIS OPPORTUNITIES.

One will answer to Jesus for every opportunity he had to witness to the lost. (Ezekiel 7:19) One will answer to Jesus for every opportunity he missed to attend worship services. (Hebrews 10:25)

(V) One will be judged according to his

Statistics tell us that one directly influences twelve people, either for good or bad. The influence of this generation will determine what the next generation will be. Our influence is like a pebble dropped into the center of a calm lake. The ripples grow larger and larger until they reach the shore. Our influence continues to grow until it reaches the judgment Seat of Christ. Although many children of God live as though they will never have to face their life's activities, the day is very near when they must meet Him in judgment. This was the most solemn thought the Apostle Paul had, he said, "Knowing therefore the terror of the LORD, we persuade men." (II Corinthians 5:11) What will your life look like when your heart is exposed at the judgment?
